Lynn Woods: Lynn, MA

With the extremely dry weather throughout New England, the potential for fire in Lynn Woods is still possible, even today. During the month of September, there have been a few brush fires that were extinguished before resulting into a major park fire. If you currently ride in Lynn Woods, you will notice the trails are dry and dusty. We urge all park uses to keep their eyes open just incase you spot a fire and report it to the Lynn fire department until we get some substantial rain fall.

McLean Plan: Belmont, MA

Have you heard of the McLean Plan? If you have not, you need to familiarizes yourself with this plan and understand the scope and potential impact on mountain biking in Massachusetts. Even though this plan revolves specifically around land located in Belmont, MA, the decision made by the land managers could have a drastic impact on mountain biking in other open space areas.

The short story of the McLean Plan as proposed by Pressley Associates, (landscape architecture firm) is to limit the current trail system to one single trail for bicyclists after taking into account use of the land in regards to trail length, sight lines, slope and erosion control.

A brief over view of this plan seem harmless to the mountain bike community; but losing trails anywhere is a reduction in our ability to enjoy the recreational sport of mountain biking. The bigger picture with the McLean Plan is the precedent it would set for organizations against mountain biking. Mountain biking has been present at the McLean Property with little to no issue since 2001 (possibly much longer) when the town drew up and official open space recreation plan. NEMBA has been involved with this process since day one. With that said, for a decision to be made now limiting mountain biking access would be an insult to the community.

You as the reader can draw your own conclusion, just remember; once a precedent is set, it opens the door for more baloney and red tape. Below are a few links regarding the McLean Project for your reading.

We are happy to be on the list of contributors for Lynn Woods and look forward increasing our support in years to come. Again, thank you to all who have supported our organization.









Pedal-kicking a small gap, we all heard a snapping sound that even made Matt say..."what as that"! Upon further inspection, we noticed the head tube had a half-inch crack and was ovalized. Another bike slated for the recycling yard.



The moral of this story; check your frame every time you ride. Weird creaking sounds in many cases are identifiers of imminent frame and/or component failure. You should consider any bike component and/or frame expendable no matter how you use it. Nothing is bulletproof!
