







IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

TRAIL THREADS

Lynn Woods: Lynn, MA

April is finally here and there is only 14 days left before Lynn Woods officially opens to us mountain bikers. We are starting off this season's trail work with a huge project. Last year we were able to cut a new trail running from Sharks Tooth Trail near RT1 that lead up to Deep Woods Trail staying within the tree line. In addition, we were able to change the status of an illegal trail, turning it into a legal trail. Now called El Sweeny Trail, this trail continues from Deep Woods Trail connecting you to Ox Pasture Road. Both these trails were cut/opened to keep you riding in the woods and are packed with lots of fun natural technical challenges.



Now the final installment of moving the old power line trail out from underneath the power lines and onto the property of Lynn Woods will be completed this month. This project encompasses cutting a new section of trail that will lead from the top of Bow Ridge near the power lines and lead you downhill through the woods on a fast flowy trail connection you to the intersection of OX Pasture Road and El Sweeny Trail. There are a few trail cross points that currently exist but are considered illegal trails by the City of Lynn. We may be able to include some portions of these trails turning them into legal sections, but the approved final trail direction allowing us to connect to the El Sweeny Trail will be determined through walk through with park management.

Everything will be ready to go by April 26! Come on down and lend a hand cutting this new trail. The more people we have, the faster the project will be completed and the quicker we can all have fun riding.

Below is a list of each approved trail days including information pertaining to the work that will be completed. As always, we look forward to any and all riders who can volunteer for these upcoming trail days. Without your help we will not be able to complete any trail work.

Saturday April 26 - Bow Ridge Trail work

This project encompasses cutting the final trail section to connect the top of Bow Ridge Trail to the new El Sweeny Trail cut back in 2007. This Trail will serve as part of the parameter Trail system around Lynn Woods. Saturday May 31 - Ridge Run Trail work

This project encompasses re-routing and rock armoring a section of Ridge Run Trail leading from trail markers E5-4 to E5-3. This trail work will make this section more appealing and offer an alternative route down from the Ballfield Trail Network.

Sunday September 14 – Overlook Trail work

This project encompasses re-routing and rock armoring a section of trail that leads from the newly installed bridges last year at marker D4-6 up to Overlook Crag. This will greatly reduce soil erosion and create a more stable trail thread.

Sunday October 12 - Ballfield area trail work

This project encompasses re-routing and rock armoring a section of trail that splits into two different paths leading up to the beginning of the Ballfield Trail. One of these trail sections was completed last year and this year we will complete the other remaining section.

We We have appoints a lead person from our group to work with Greenbelt regarding establishing a few trail days this season. Greenbelt is very receptive to mountain biking and currently allows year round biking on Tompson Street Reservation. We look forward becoming involved on their property and work with other local bike advocacy groups such as NSNEMBA who have shown an interest in preserving this great location.

We will keep the community posted on our meeting and hope that trail dates can be established during this month for publication in our next newsletter issue. For now, please remember the B&T's trail network spans land owned by Essex County Greenbelt and a number of private landowners. Currently mountain biking as allowed year round, but we ask that you use some common sense when riding there during the spring months. The next few months can bring lots of rain making a number of trails soft and not some much fun to ride. During this time, the trail system is at its most sensitive, so again just use common sense when riding.





3rd Annual Lynn Woods Opening Day Ride!

On Saturday April 19th, Dieselbikes will be hosting its 3 annual Lynn Woods Opening Day Ride. This is a gathering of fellow mountain bikers enjoying the first full weekend of riding in Lynn. We encourage anyone who rides a bike to come on down and head out for a wonderful ride in Lynn. We meet at the Ballfield parking lot just off our RT129 starting at 9:30am. Suit up, stretch out those legs and hit the trails at 10:00am. We have no set pace, no set course and no set time to finish. This ride will last most of the day. If you cannot make it at 10:00am, come anytime; we are sure you will come across our group in the woods.

During our ride, we may conduct a little trail work such as clean up and removal of any fallen trees or crap on the trails. Make sure you bring plenty of snacks and water to stay hydrated. We do plan on riding even if the weather is crappy unless it is raining. Other then that, it will be a full day of riding and you are invited to join us.
