TRAIL THREADS

Lynn Woods: Lynn, MA

April 15th is just around the corner and this means Lynn Woods will officially open for another great season of mountain biking fun. Once again we will be kicking off the biking season with our 4th Annual Lynn Woods Group Ride. Dieselbikes and fellow riders will meet at the Ballfield Parking lot located at 78 Great Woods Road. Meeting time is between 9:00-9:20am. We'll be hitting the trails at 9:30. The ride will cover some of the best trails including: Espresso, Sharks Tooth and the Figure 8 loop. This is always a great time and perfect for anyone who is unfamiliar with the trail network.

We have been out inspecting the trails getting ready for our first trail work day happening on Sunday April 26th. Even though we had a long, harsh winter, it appears the trails on the north side have held up well with no issues to report. In speaking with the Park Ranger last month, it seems this has been another successful year where the majority of mountain bikers have respected the closure period. Obviously with the snow gone and warmer weather here, there have been a number of bike tracks starting to appear; however they are mostly on Bow Ridge and towards the far north near Lynnfield.

Since the riding season is here, grab yourself a copy of our 2009 Lynn Woods Mountain Biker Map. This is not an official City of Lynn or Park's Department map, but a useful reference for identifying trail names and points of interest for mountain bikers. Tompson St. Reservation (TSR) / Bruce & Tom's (B&T's): Gloucester, MA

We are happy to announce the first ever Tompson Street Reservation Trail Maintenance Series. It has taken a ton of work in the past few years to reach this point, but we are happy to have gained approval from the Essex County Greenbelt Association (ECGA) to move forward with this trail series.

The 2009 Tompson Trail Maintenance Series is presented by ECGA, Dieselbikes, Sinister Bikes and NSNEMBA. We have four planned trail maintenance days occurring this season, all are geared to making Tompson Street. and portions known as Bruce &Tom's more sustainable for long-term mountain bike use. This is just the beginning of 20+ projects on the table all designed to increase the fun factor of the trail network while remaining within the conservation restrictions set forth by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Get ready for an exciting season of trail work and riding at this great location.

Over the next few months we will work with ECGA to address trail names and network identification points. At this point there is no specific mountain bike trail map available; however ECGA has created and posted a trail map on their website that provides a great representation of the current trail network. You can view or download a copy of this map by clicking on this link.

Trail Network Disclaimer -

As always, please remember Tompson Street and B&T's trail networks spans land owned by Essex County Greenbelt and a number of private landowners. Currently mountain biking is allowed year round on Greenbelt managed property called Tompson Street Reservation (TSR) but may not be allowed on adjacent private property. We ask that you use some common sense when riding there. Stick to the main trail that you know and do not cut new lines/braids.

If you come across a change in the trail that you think is illegal, please do not change anything. Report it to <u>Dieselbikes</u>, <u>Sinister Bikes</u> and or <u>NSNEMBA</u>. We have plenty of members that ride this location and will resolve such matters to reduce any potential conflicts. There will be continuing efforts to make the network better and this will take some time to accomplish with proper land manager approval





TRAIL THREADS [CONTINUE]

Salem Woods: Salem, MA

Just a few days away: the Friends of Salem Woods will be holding their first trail maintenance day in Salem Woods. Dieselbikes has committed a few of its members to help out and we are excited to work side by side with other advocacy groups.

The City of Salem in conjunction with the <u>Friends of Salem Woods</u> applied for and received a State Trail Improvements Grant totaling \$6,560. An estimated 30 trail work volunteers are needed on April 4, 2009, at 9:30 AM to begin Phase 1 of this trail rehabilitation project. This grant has been used to purchase materials to restore approximately 500 feet of existing trail by elevating the trail closer to its historic height and reduce the "mudding" from standing water.

Volunteers are needed for 4-5 hours, 16 years and older please, food will be provided. Friends of Salem Woods are coordinating the trail improvements. Construction will start on Saturday April 4th at 9:30 AM and volunteers are to meet at the entrance to Salem Woods. Rain date will be on Saturday April 11th, also at 9:30 AM. 



DB GROUP RIDES

We are a simple group of mountain bikers with average riding skills who like to ride with anyone who loves this sport. Whether you are just a beginner or a pro racer, it does not matter; you are more than welcome to join our group rides.

With spring upon us, our weekly group rides will start on April 18th and run until mid November. During this time, we try to ride a number of different trails throughout New England as well as taking occasional day or weekend trips to the mountains.

Beginning April 21st, our Tuesday Night Rides (TNR) in Lynn Woods return for another season. This is a 2+ hour ride that breaks up the work week with a post ride gathering in the Naked Fish for refreshments.

As of April 25th, our weekend group rides will begin again. These rides typically occur both Saturday and Sunday with different locations depending on the club's schedule and weather conditions. Weekend rides can last 3-4 hours and offer plenty of fun and group camaraderie.

None of our group rides are fast paced. We're also not out to cover as much ground as possible. We are out to have fun and we ride at the group's pace.
