TRAIL THREADS

Lynn Woods Reservation (LYW): Lynn, MA

September is upon us and we will be continuing our trail work program with two trail maintenance days scheduled for Saturday September 12 and Sunday October 11. These trail days will allow us to finish up some of the sections we have been working on over the last few years and allow us to move to other areas in 2010.

Last month an article written by the Associated Press and published in the Boston Herald made reference to Lynn Woods and how mountain bikers are destroying the trails. We received several e-mails from local area riders asking if the article was accurate and if new problems were developing. We spoke to park management after reading the article and they assured us that no relationship problems exist between themselves & mountain bikers in Lynn Woods.

The article referred to the concerns of the National Forest Service and their attempts to crack down on rogue trails being cut by a very small group of aggressive mountain bikers across the country. Lynn Woods is city owned property and has nothing to do with the National Forest Service, but Lynn Woods is a well known local mountain biking spot and it was assumed that Lynn Woods was part of the problem. Some of you may remember back to 1998 -99 when the park did have a problematic user relationship, but that has all changed and we are working in close collaboration with park management to ensure our relationship remains strong.

Lynn Woods is not perfect (no place is) and we continue to deal with rogue trails that occasionally pop up. Some of these trails predate Dieselbikes, but in general the problems that once existed in Lynn have been greatly reduced and park management is generally happy with the results of our collaborations.


Finding balance with all park users has been an uphill battle, but we at Dieselbikes believe we are heading in the right direction in Lynn and park management assures us that if there are any problems, we will be the first to hear about it. [Click here to read a scanned copy of this article]

Tompson Reservation (TSR) / Bruce & Tom's (B&T's): Gloucester, MA

We have had reports that some of the trails are getting torn up by ATVs. Motorized vehicles are illegal in Tompson Reservation but as with a number of other locations, ATV usage still occurs. Unfortunately, some of the trail work conducted this past spring with Sinister Bikes and NSNEMBA has been destroyed.

It also has been brought to our attention that other recreational user groups have submitted complaints to the property managers (ECGA) regarding trail issues and concerns. We will be working with ECGA to get to the root of these issues and develop a method for curbing trail destruction by motorized vehicles.

With that said, there is a trail day scheduled for Sunday September 13, however due to the above factors and some resource scheduling constraints; we have cancelled this month's trail day at Thompson Reservation. There is a second trail work day scheduled for Saturday October 17 and we intend to implement this project as planned.



3rd Annual D-Day Mountain Bike EXPO [Lynn Woods, MA]

It is our great pleasure to announce that the 3rd Annual D-Day Mountain Bike event, held on June 13, 2009, was a big success for the Lynn Woods Reservation. This year we had a record number of registered participants, totaling over 150; double that of last year. Along with this record number of participants came a record amount of funds generated to support the trail network at Lynn Woods.

This year the event generated \$750 - a 50% increase over the 2008 D-Day event. Despite a cold, rain-soaked week, D-Day was blessed with one day of perfect sunshine. Thanks to the weather we were able to pull off a full day of events, games, group rides and demo equipment. DB PRODUCT & TRAIL FUNDRAISING

At Dieselbikes we want to stress the importance of supporting your local trail network. Many of us take for granted the trails we ride and the impact we have on those trails as a group. Regardless of whether you ride locally, or travel to ride in other places, the fact remains that mountain bike trails do not take care of themselves. Many individuals, groups and official organizations throughout New England repair trail damage caused by you, the single rider.

In today's society, supporting your local trail has become more important than ever. With declining or minimal park budgets, land development contracts and the perception that our recreational sport destroys the environment, we as a bike community must band together to support and maintain our beloved trails.

We ask all riders in the community to step up and support your local trail network. This is a pretty easy task to accomplish in two simple ways: first, volunteer for as many local and regional trail days as you can; second, if you cannot volunteer, donate money to responsible organizations that help maintain our trails. It is that simple! Without your support bike trails will disappear forever.





DB GROUP RIDES

We are a simple group of mountain bikers with average riding skills who like to ride with anyone who loves this sport. Whether you are just a beginner or a pro racer, it does not matter; you are more than welcome to join our group rides. Riders under 18 must be present with a parent or guardian and speak with the ride leader before the group ride begins.

With the riding season in full swing, our weekly and weekend group rides will run until mid November. During this time, we try to ride a number of different trails throughout New England as well as taking occasional day or weekend trips to the mountains.

TNR - Tuesday Night Rides in Lynn Woods

Dieselbikes' Tuesday Night Rides are going strong in their 3rd season with new faces just about every week. Meeting time is between 5:45pm and 6:00pm at the former Lucille's Fine Chicken parking lot (215 Broadway (Route 1), Lynnfield, MA, 01940). Please note that Lucille's is currently out of business however we still have this area as our meeting location. This is a two hour ride that occurs every Tuesday night and breaks up the work week with a post ride gathering at Bostonville for refreshments. All levels are welcome and NO ONE is left behind!

TNR² – Thursday Night Rides in Lynn Woods

Dieselbikes' Thursday Night Rides are in their 2nd season. Meeting time is between 5:45pm and 6:00pm at the Ballfield Parking lot, Great Woods Entrance (78 Great Woods Road Lynn, MA 01904). This is a 90 minute cardio ride with limited technical challenge, but is a great endurance builder. All levels are welcome and NO ONE is left behind!





Weekend Sessions

These group rides typically occur both Saturday and Sunday with different locations depending on the club's schedule and weather conditions. Weekend rides can last 3-4 hours and offer plenty of fun and group camaraderie. None of these weekend sessions are fast paced. We're also not out to cover as much ground as possible. WE ARE OUT TO HAVE FUN AND WE RIDE AT THE GROUP'S PACE! We ride technical trails and love to challenge our own skill sets.
