
TRAIL THREADS



YEAR END TRAIL WORK REPORT

2009 was another successful year for trail building. We were able to host 4 maintenance days in Lynn Woods and support 2 additional trail days at Tompson Reservation in conjunction with Sinister Bikes and NSNEMBA. Looking back on all we have done, we are proud to be a part of this great mountain bike community and look forward to continuing our efforts in 2010.

Our dedicated base of core volunteers have made Dieselbikes trail advocacy what it is today. Without their unselfish support the club would not have been able to accomplish such a vast amount of trail work. We look forward to stepping up our efforts outside our local riding area in 2010 and to supporting other great trail locations in their efforts at trail maintenance and management. Below is a quick recap of the volunteer work services provided by Dieselbikes this year.

Lynn Woods Reservation (LYW): Lynn, MA

This has been our fifth full season of trail work in Lynn Woods. The hours of volunteer service, program preparation and core dedication are paying off. Lynn Woods is on track to become one of the best maintained trails north of Boston.

This year we focused on continuing maintenance projects for trails that were installed years ago. We enhanced section of Espresso, Overlook and Wolf Pit's Trails as well extending the famous Meeting House Swamp Bridge to ensure better longevity to the bridge.

Dieselbikes completed 202 volunteer labor hours of maintenance on Lynn Woods' mountain bike trails this year. Over the past 5 yeas of service, we have completed a total of 24 separate trail projects and will be working on bigger and more technical projects within the next 5 years. We want to thank our core members, additional volunteers and industry sponsors who have contributed to these efforts.

Despite the vast amount of work Dieselbikes has completed, we want to give a shout out to all the other volunteer groups who also support and maintain Lynn Woods' trails. We are not the only ones maintaining Lynn Woods, & we know it. Hats off to ALL!

Tompson Reservation (TSR) / Bruce & Tom's (B&T's): Gloucester, MA

This was another year of great trail work at Tompson Reservation. Our partnership with Sinister Bikes and NSNEMBA continued and although we were only able to complete 2 of the 4 scheduled maintenance projects, the work completed was essential and fun for all who volunteered. The three groups completed 116 hours of combined volunteer service on ECGA managed land.

Dieselbikes plans on increasing our efforts next year and to continue our partnerships with Sinister Bikes, NSNEMBA and ECGA management to roll out some large scale projects for this trail network. Be on the look out for more information regarding any upcoming trail work at Tompson Reservation in the coming months. Volunteers will be needed & are always appreciated!

Salem Woods (SLW): Salem, MA

Dieselbikes expanded our efforts and helped out some fellow mountain bikers who organize and maintain Salem Woods. The project was in conjunction with the City of Salem and Friends of Salem Woods regarding a State Trail Improvement Grant for elevating approximately 500 feet of trail back to its original thread height.

This was a back-breaking project with over 30 volunteers participating. The project was broken down into two separate trail maintenance dates and has become a huge success for all recreational users. Dieselbikes was happy to help out and support another trail network that is friendly to the mountain biking community.

Forest Service Open to Allowing Mountain Bikes on Continental Divide Trail!

Along its 3,100 miles that wind from the Canadian border down to Mexico, the Continental Divide Trail is one of the most rugged, and in parts one of the most visually spectacular, hiking trails in the country. Now the U.S. Forest Service says the route could be opened in places to mountain bikes, a move that raises a question or two regarding possible impacts to national parks.

From north to south the trail runs through portions of Glacier, Yellowstone, and Rocky Mountain national parks, as well as El Malpais National Monument in New Mexico. In places you need the skills of a mountain goat to negotiate the route, which, by the way, is not entirely in place...


