## TRAIL THREADS

### Lynn Woods (LYW): Lynn, MA

Well it was fun while it lasted! Unfortunately we are sad to report that Lucille's Fine Chicken Restaurant on Route 1 North in Lynnfield has closed. Or as they say in the industry...OUT OF BUSINESS! Lucille's was playing host to Dieselbikes Tuesday night group rides by allowing us to play a mountain bike movie at the bar after our ride.

This was fun for all that participated and we are extremely sad they had to close. As of last Tuesday, there were no signs posted stating the lot is off limits so we will still be parking at that location until further notice. We are attempting to contact the restaurant owner who is also the land owner to see what the future may hold.



If you're riding in Lynn Woods, be on the look out for some large fallen trees across the trail. The park ranger has been notified and will be out in a week or two to remove them from the trail. We ask that you just walk your bike around them for the mean time and not to cut a braid; the trees will be removed. There are currently two trees down on the north side of Lynn Woods near Lynnfield and one additional tree located on the south side near under cliff trail.

### Sunday River Bike Park (SRBP): Newry, ME

We had a good size crew visit Sunday River Bike Park this past month and boy is that place fun! If you are a gravity rider, then you need to visit this place at least once this season. Steve Boulanger, his staff and a host of volunteers have been working as much as possible to recondition the trails and add some new features. This season has been tough with all the rain New England has received. The day we rode the weather was sunny however the trails were still wet and slimy...but that just makes it more fun and added another level of technical challenge.



This year Sunday River is utilizing the newly installed Chondola that takes you directly to the north peak quickly rather than previous years of using two chairlifts or stopping short of the base lodge to head back up. The Chondola is a great addition however we heard complaining regarding the current method of bike loading. All we can say, management will be working on a better method to get the bikers up the mountain fast in the future, but overall, this is still much better than previous years.

Dieselbikes will be heading back to Sunday River during the month of August (mid August timeframe) to ride the mountain, feel free to join our group for a day of gravity riding! # THE TEST REPORT

From time to time, bicycle industry representatives ask Dieselmikes to test and provide feedback on the quality & performance characteristics of their products. Other times we purchase products and perform our own un-biased reviews. In both cases we publish our findings to the community unless otherwise specified by the manufacture.

Product reviews published by Dieselmikes are written to reflect facts but may contain opinions and statements that you may disagree with. We recommend that you always seek out additional third-party reviews or contact the manufacturer for more information on a specific product.

## Telonix 26x2.60 Hans Rey's Signature Series Kenda Tire

### Off the Shelf

The Telonix tire I purchased is the wire bead version with 2-ply sidewall construction and Kenda's "STICK-E" compound (P/N 212377). It can be used as either a front or back tire, has a specific rotational direction, and is available in a smaller 26x2.40 size wire bead or 26x2.40 & 2.20 folding bead versions.

Grabbing the tire right off the shelf you notice its aggressive thread pattern and physical weight, around 1508 grams [3.32lbs]. There is a ton of rubber on this tire and Kenda gives a varying weight ratio of +/-85 grams. I know many riders that are concerned with the physical weight of bicycle components, but I personally do not care as long as the product performs to the manufacturer's claims.



The tire's thread is one of the most aggressive patterns I have seen on a mountain bike tire. Large pronounced center knobs broken down into two staggered positions that reach out towards the mid-point of the tire's crown. The side knobs are also pronounced with a square "H" type shape that is also in a staggered pattern. Right off the bat this is not going to be a fast rolling tire, rather the claim to fame for this tire is its insane traction on varying trail conditions and terrain.

### The Manufacture's Claim

Kenda claims the following, as quoted from their website: "...Given the scope of this race and the varying terrain Hans rides, a versatile tire is needed. One that can go uphill just as fast as downhill. The Telonix is just that. Taller and longer center knobs provide uphill grip and soft gradual ramp at the front provides downhill speed. The "H" shaped side knobs not only provide aggressive cornering bite, but also pay homage to the man himself. Its an all-round tire that works for all styles of riding, depending on the size of the tire and its compound it can be used for XC, Downhill, Freeride and Trials and everything in between."

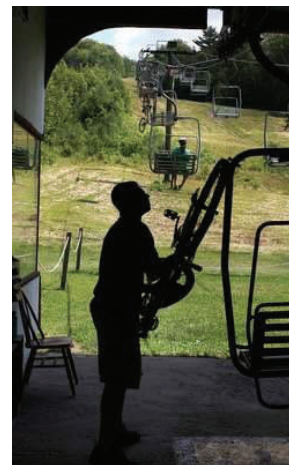


### Mountain Biking Reaches New Heights

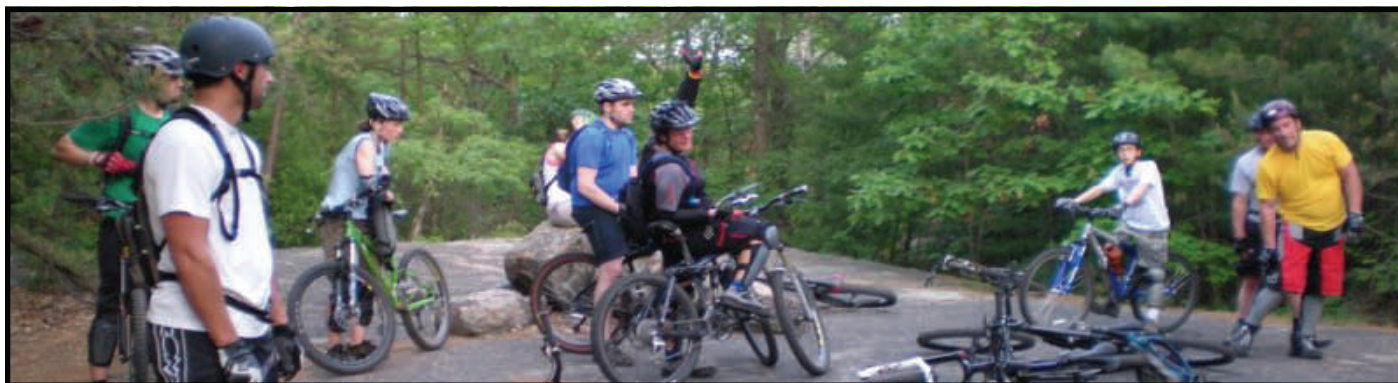

## DB PRODUCT & TRAIL FUNDRAISING

At Dieselbikes we want to stress the importance of supporting your local trail network. Many of us take for granted the trails we ride and the impact we have on those trails as a group. Regardless of whether you ride locally, or travel to ride in other places, the fact remains that mountain bike trails do not take care of themselves. Many individuals, groups and official organizations throughout New England repair trail damage caused by you, the single rider.

In today's society, supporting your local trail has become more important than ever. With declining or minimal park budgets, land development contracts and the perception that our recreational sport destroys the environment, we as a bike community must band together to support and maintain our beloved trails.

We ask all riders in the community to step up and support your local trail network. This is a pretty easy task to accomplish in two simple ways: first, volunteer for as many local and regional trail days as you can; second, if you cannot volunteer, donate money to responsible organizations that help maintain our trails. It is that simple! Without your support bike trails will disappear forever.



## DB GROUP RIDES

We are a simple group of mountain bikers with average riding skills who like to ride with anyone who loves this sport. Whether you are just a beginner or a pro racer, it does not matter; you are more than welcome to join our group rides. Riders under 18 must be present with a parent or guardian and speak with the ride leader before the group ride begins.
